PARENTS'S ORIENTATION

A very good morning to Venerable Sir Dr. Nando Batha, founder and chairman of Bodhisukha School, who is also our chief guest today.

It gives me immense pleasure to present the annual report of Bodhisukha School for the session 2021-22. A warm welcome to everyone. This year also we had started our academic session amidst the second wave of the Covid-19 pandemic, but still we tried to excel not only in academics but also in sports and other co-curricular activities. Our annual report will help us to appreciate how much thus far we have achieved individually and as a school and at the same time, enable us to understand how far we can go by using our full potential.

PARENTS'S ORIENTATION

Regular scheduled online classes started from 8th April 2021. Parents' orientation for each and every class was conducted online. The orientation for class XI was conducted in the month of July. Apart from this, we had several rounds of PTMs held online and offline as well; which helped us to establish a healthy relation with parents. This is the only forum where parents could discuss their concerns with the teachers in a constructive & systematized way with proper details and reports pertaining to the student's performance. In addition, PTMs helped us to fulfill the expectations of the parents by taking a robust approach to manage all their grievances.

In order to ensure the continuity of students' learning and effective teaching, several activities during the lockdown period were conducted online. Students from Play group to class XII had their online classes in the core subjects through Zoom Cloud Meeting app. Along with the BDS App, this year we had introduced Google Classroom App through which we used to give assignments, project works etc. The schedule for the classes and the corresponding links for the online classes were sent through the BDS app. As per the State Government's order, our school had reopened for classes 8 to 12 from 7th February 2022. Rest other classes, from Play Group to class 7, continued with the online mode of education. Classes 9 & 11 gave their half-yearly 7 final exams in school; whereas, class 8 only gave their final exams offline. Rest, students from Play group to class 7 gave all their exams online. The students had to make use of the Exam Portal of BDS for checking and uploading of question papers and answer scripts. The Exam Portal remained an integral part of our academic assessments. I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate our web master Mr. Maung and his IT team whose efforts have paid off. We proudly declare that Online Assessment was a regular feature of our online schooling even this year. We congratulate each and every teacher of our school for conducting the online classes religiously as per schedule. Each and every staff came to school when ever required.

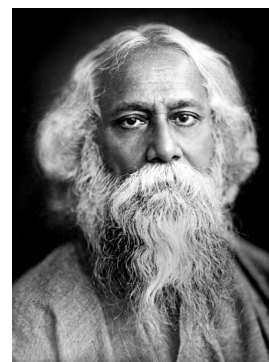

SCHOOL FUNCTIONS

This year, with the school shut due to the second Wave of Covid-19 pandemic, all kinds of celebrations had to be shifted to the virtual platform, with all kinds of events- ranging from cultural performances to debates- all were planned and executed digitally just like the previous year. However, we chose the virtual platform to celebrate all the events that we would have otherwise celebrated in our school campus if the situation was normal. MAY

The first online event that we celebrated this year was Rabindra Jayanti, on 9th May and which is still available in the Facebook page and 'YouTube' channel of Bodhisukha School. Students from Play group to XII participated in this virtual event. It was a wonderful experience for all as the pandemic turned us towards the real digital world. Students from their homes performed several Rabindra sangeet, Rabindra Nritya and recited poems of Rabindranath Tagore. The program started with a melodious song by one of our students from junior school. Our student Ritika Karmakar of class XII Science, beautifully hosted this event.



We had also organized a virtual Ambrosia Festival on 15th May. It was a house competition both for junior & senior school. In the competition students stated very beautifully why fresh fruit juice should be consumed instead of cold drinks available in the market. Through this festival Bodhisukha School tried to impart the importance of healthy food intake and avoiding junk foods to the students.

This year, for the first time we had organised an online Summer Camp in partnership with Creatree Services. It was a 2 weeks certificate course on public speaking, debating, extempore, creative writing. It was directed by Vijayanti Bhattacharjee. She is an Indian entrepreneur who had lived in Bahrain for over a decade until 2020. She runs her own PR, Marketing, Advertising & Event Management agency called CreaTree Services based out of India and the Middle East. She has worked as an editor, writer, poet and blogger with over 17 years of experience in the print and publishing media, both in India and Bahrain. She has also worked as a PR professional with the Kempinski group of hotels, Veritas PR, etc. While in India, she has worked with internationally acclaimed companies like Macmillan India Ltd and SAGE Publications India Pvt Ltd, besides freelancing for various popular Indian dailies like The Statesman, Hindustan Times, right from her University days. In Bahrain, she had worked as an editor for various magazines and newspapers like Bahrain This Month, Weekender, Sabaya, Mayadeen, Bahrain This Week, and so on. In the course of her career, Vijayantee has conducted several high-profile interviews of several celebrities, industrialists, actors, artists, ambassadors to countries, besides writing about travel, food, lifestyle, architecture, and so on. Vijayantee is a poet too and her anthology of poems, Mosaic Vision, was launched at the Oxford Bookstore in 2017. This year, we had a very short summer vacation of only 2 weeks and we resumed our online classes from 18th June, 2021. In the pandemic situation, we faced difficulty in delivering books and stationary items but still we managed. However, we used to post all study materials, images of the lessons, home assignments and other crucial learning materials in our E-Diary, Google Classroom App and BDS App to facilitate the teaching-learning process throughout this academic session.



In order to ensure that our students are equipped to face any challenge we have emphasized on a number of students enrichment programs, by involving them in various activities, like preparing projects, charts, models and others by using the help of digital platform.

JUNE

In order to ensure overall development of our students even in the lockdown, we conducted our house and club meetings regularly. House Meets were conducted to make necessary discussions related to inter-house competitions. We allowed our students to participate in various inter-house competitions to offer them a chance to display their talent but also help them learn valuable lessons on team work and selfless service even during the trying times. Respective House Masters of all the four houses (Red, Green, Blue & Yellow respectively), posted the links for their house meetings in BDS app. The Club masters of the six clubs ie., Singing, Dancing, Recitation, Drama, Art & Craft and Yoga Club also posted the zoom links in BDS app. Students belonging to the respective Houses and Clubs actively participated in all these meetings.

Our students performed various yoga asana which was really entertaining and interesting to watch and learn. The students also gave a speech on the benefits of yoga. The COVID 19 had turned the world upside down. 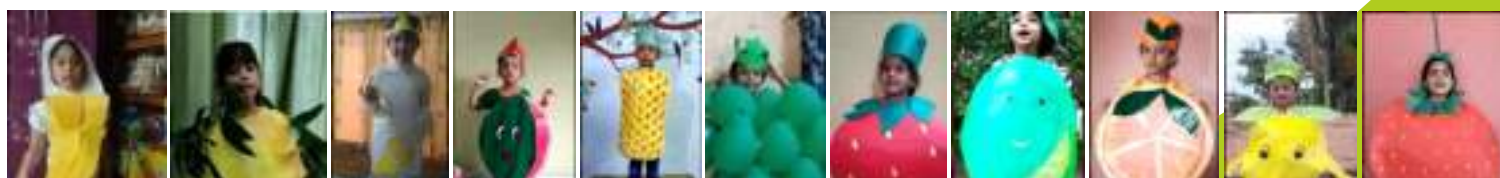
SEPTEMBER

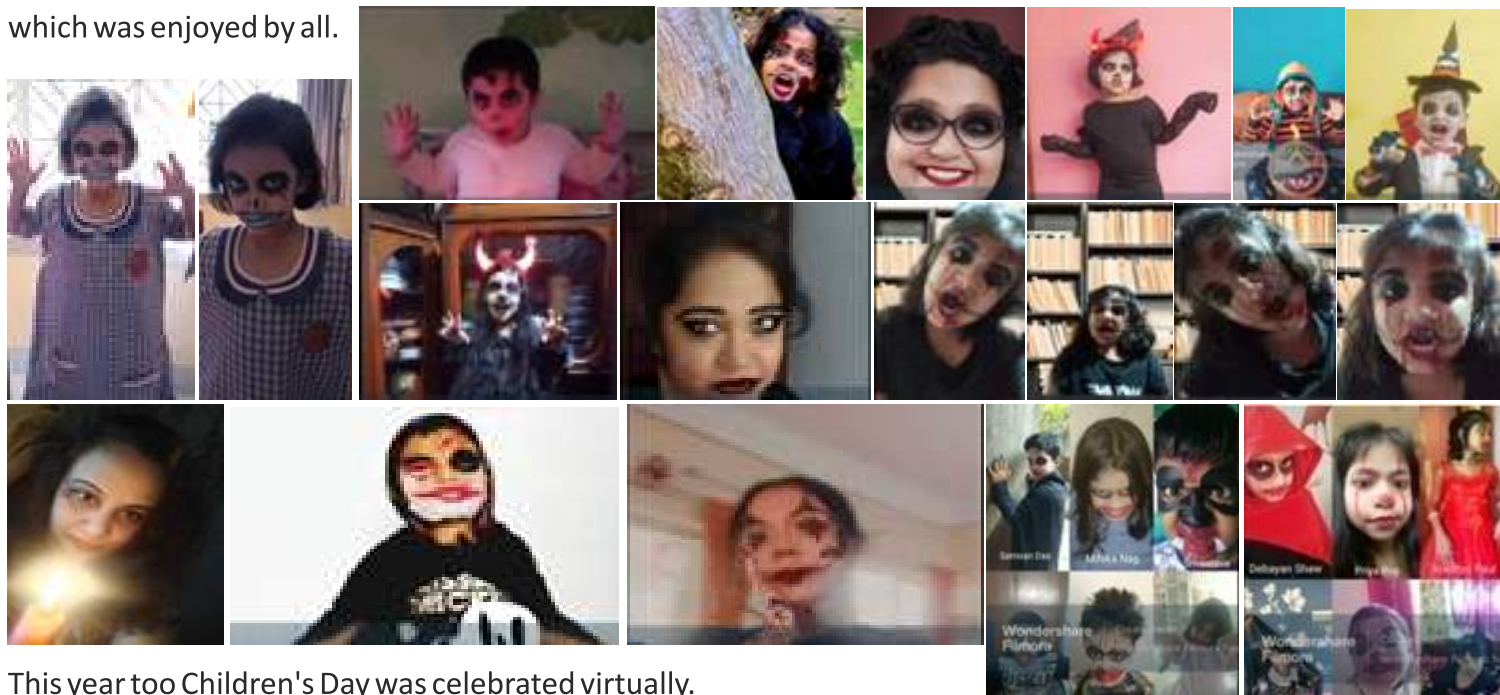


NOVEMBER

MENTAL HEALTH

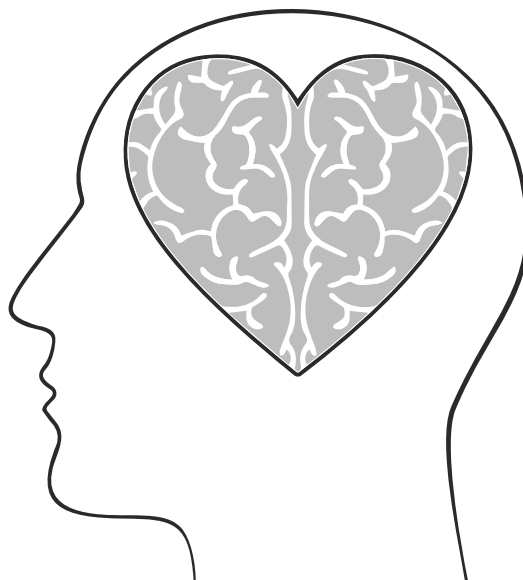
